Opportunity

SJI is searching for a unique individual to take on the role of Executive Director. Reporting to the St. John's Institute (SJI) Board of Directors, the Executive Director is responsible for the organization's consistent achievement of its mission and vision, programs and services as well as financial objectives. The Executive Director will be the direct supervisor of SJI staff and provide them mentoring and coaching support ensuring accountability to defined goals and objectives. To ensure the ongoing financial stewardship and community awareness of SJI, the Executive Director will have responsibility for fund development and community relations. The Executive Director will play an important external leadership role, in building and sustaining relations with board members, staff, volunteers, committees, service partners, residents, funders, volunteers and the public.

You are described as a strong leader with excellent interpersonal, oral and written communication skills who possesses the ability to exercise tact, discretion and good judgment at all times.
